Greetings

It is unfortunate, but agriculture is still the greatest cause of habitat destruction, the main cause of wildlife loss and has caused roughly 80% of the deforestation in this century. About 30% of the weight of birds on Earth are wild species. The rest are poultry. Just 4% of mammals, by weight, are wild, 36% is accounted for by humans, and farmed animals make up the remaining 60%. We all need food, but agriculture is among the world's foremost causes of climate breakdown, of water and air pollution, and it's the leading cause of land use. Even so, millions still go hungry. New Zealanders eat about 75kg of meat annually, compared with 124 kg in the USA and 4kg in India.

George Monbiot's 15 minute TED talk on YouTube "Can we feed ourselves without devouring the planet?" is thought-provoking, and his book "Regenesis" from Auckland Libraries is worth reading for more detail. Monbiot has a vision for a new future for food and humanity suggesting that by having a plantbased diet instead of eating meat, and creating food from bacteria (which we already eat in yoghurt and some cheeses) we could restore the Earth's living systems and replace the age of extinction with an age of regenesis.

Welcome to the July issue of the magazine, which includes many topics of interest to the local community. Look at the many changes happening to the property market from this month. See how important it is to choose the right real estate agent for your property. So many activities rely on volunteers and there are plenty of opportunities and events where this applies in the community. It's not an issue we might want to think about, but so many Kiwis haven't made a will, creating difficulties for those left behind, and this is the month to create one. Read the review of Dr Ritchie's encouraging book on why things are getting better for the planet despite the many problems we face, and she also has a TED talk, but note the reviewer's observation that we all need to take action to counter the inertia of those in power.

govern their own affairs and promised that their treasures of land, forest and sea would be protected. The Treaty also affirmed the right of migrants from Britain to settle in Aotearoa. Those settlers brought with them their



religion, culture and traditions. As the settler population grew to substantially outnumber Māori, their religion, culture and traditions became dominant.

However, Māori, the indigenous people of Aotearoa, had their own religion, culture and traditions which gave them identity and a rounded perspective of life. Tauiwi (later arrivals) are beginning to discover that indigenous Māori values, spirituality, and traditions are of immense importance too.

It is an excellent source of protein as well as micro-nutrients and many communities throughout the world rely on it as an important source of nutrition. But in the not-too-distant past many oceans were being overfished, threatening the survival of individual species, and 15



years ago a third of the world's fish stocks were over-exploited.

However, in the last 30 years, seafood production has more than doubled. Regulation has enabled endangered fish stocks to recover, and the remaining demand for fish has been supplied by "aquaculture" or "fish farming", currently 100 million tonnes of seafood world-wide a year. Regulation includes monitoring of fish stocks, implementation of strict fishing quotas, reduction of unwanted fish in the catch, curbing of bottom trawling, and an increase in marine protected areas. Consumers who want to choose sustainable options can google "Best Fish Guide New Zealand" and review the Forest & Bird 2017 guide. Don't choose orange roughy or black cardinal fish.



The Church building and graveyard are maintained by descendants of the early Hobsonville settler families, who are volunteers. The grounds are lovingly cared for





A walk through the graveyard reflects the strong connection Hobsonville had to the brick and pottery making industry, with the graveyard monuments commemorating significant ceramic manufacturers, including Clark, Carder and Vazey, and other Hobsonville potters including Cater, Holland and Ockleston.

We don't know who was buried in a number of the graves. We also did not know the location in the graveyard where some individuals are known to have been buried. In April 2024 Dr Hans-Dieter Bader, an archaeologist from Archaeology Solutions Ltd, surveyed part of the graveyard, walking areas of possible unmarked graves using ground-penetrating radar and found 9 grave plots that we didn't know about. It is likely that a couple of these newly-found grave plots were for children. We have marked the grave sites of these unknown people with plaques. We are yet to survey the remaining half of the graveyard, including the Scott Road side of the Churchyard, for more unknown gravesites.

Pukenga Nui internship

Building confidence and connection for rangatahi in West Auckland, the initiation of the Pukenga Nui internship in November 2023 was a promising addition to the Active Whakapapa kaupapa.



With backing from the Waitākere Ranges Local Board,

this paid internship programme embarked on a dual mission; to explore avenues for rangatahi (youth) economic empowerment and to support the iwi Te Kawerau a Maki to deliver the Active Whakapapa hīkoi (walks).

The overarching goal that emerged, was to test a career pathway for interns that would transition into roles as Active Whakapapa tour guides. To support this endeavour, Healthy Families Waitākere worked alongside the interns to co-design a programme that would focus on equipping them with the appropriate skills to lead an Active Whakapapa hīkoi and to strengthen their connections to whakapapa (genealogy) and taiao (natural environment). Field training, led by partners Te Kawerau a Maki and Adventure Works, was an integral part of the internship programme. Sessions with Te Kawerau a Maki encompassed crafting pepeha, delivering mihi and karakia, and delving into local mana whenua history through pūrakau.

Reflecting on her experience, graduating intern Tamera Wharewaka explains. "One of the highlights was spending time with Tyler from Te Kawarau a Maki. We learned more about the iwi and even got to go on a walk that might one day get developed into an Active Whakapapa hīkoi."

Adventure Works, who run outdoor education courses and qualifications, were enlisted to oversee the outdoor education component of the programme. Their primary focus was to teach health and safety protocols, leadership skills, and foster proficiency in leading outdoor expeditions. To align to the needs of the Active Whakapapa hīkoi, Adventure Works modified their Level 3

Certificate in Assistant Outdoor Leadership to include a portion dedicated to iwi knowledge and whakapapa.

"Our collaboration with Te Kawerau a Maki and Adventure Works sparked some thought-provoking conversations around being responsive to the needs of Māori. It was a positive experience which led to Adventure Works developing a tailored certification for the interns" explains Healthy Families Systems Innovator Rea Kenkel.

In March 2024, the Pukenga Nui internship culminated with the interns demonstrating their knowledge and skills by leading a group through the Orangihina Harbourview hīkoi, which Wharewaka says provided an enriching experience.

"This experience has shown me a lot. By observing outdoor leadership in practice and immersing in outdoor activities, we can enrich our understanding of the land and cultivate invaluable leadership skills."

In April, the Active Whakapapa kaupapa was handed over to Te Kawerau a Maki. With this transition, the iwi is now equipped to lead and refine Active Whakapapa, and by extension, oversee Pukenga Nui on an as-needed basis. www.healthyfamilieswaitakere.org.nz.

Kip McGrath Education

Recent changes in NCEA mean that, in mathematics education, students are now required to demonstrate several strategies to solve problems whereas, in the past, they could use just one - usually an algorithm. Now children develop their understanding of a concept by approaching it several ways. Greater thinking skills and an increased number of methods are required. They not only have to find the answers to



problems but also demonstrate their thinking in the process and show this in their written answers. At NCEA level, students may only achieve Excellence if they present a detailed explanation - both verbal and numerical - of how they reached their conclusion.

The ReCreators Green Space

The ReCreators, Green Space, located on Chamberlain Rd in Massey, is now open and processing/ selling reclaimed timber, breathing new life into discarded wood through community-driven woodworking and furniture restoration classes. This initiative not only promotes sustainable practices but also empowers individuals with valuable skills.

A significant milestone for The ReCreators came in February this year when Makerspace, a company that distributes laser and CNC machines, offered a 2-tonne CNC machine to our



Green Space. This generous donation came via Concretec, based in the Bombay Hills, who were upgrading their equipment and eager to see their massive machine go to a deserving school or charity. Recognising the potential of this opportunity, we eagerly accepted the challenge.

The journey to accommodate the CNC machine was no small feat. Our space needed substantial preparations, including ensuring the availability of three-phase electrics and modifying the physical layout to fit the machine. The CNC is particularly wide, necessitating the removal of a door and precise crane and dolly positioning. After much effort, the CNC machine was successfully crane-lifted into our facility in mid-June.

Now, The ReCreators are focused on securing funding to complete the machine's implementation and train a technician to operate it effectively. But what exactly is a CNC machine? CNC stands for computer numerical control, a technology that uses computer software to manage the movement and operation of machines. These machines can cut, carve, or engrave various materials with high precision. With this advanced equipment, we aim to enhance our ability to design and utilise reclaimed timber, pushing the boundaries of what can be achieved in upcycling.

Our expanded capabilities at The ReCreators Green Space will allow us to offer even more to the community. By combining traditional woodworking skills with modern technology, we provide a unique learning environment that encourages creativity, sustainability, and practical skill development. The integration of the CNC machine



Fire extinguishers: Safeguarding lives and property

Fire extinguishers play a crucial role in safeguarding lives and property during emergencies.

Understanding the importance and difference in extinguishers and what to use and when is fundamental in ensuring the safety of your family and home.

Consideration for your extinguisher should include where to keep it.

- They should be visible and easily accessible.
- In or near the kitchen, (but not too close to the stove)
- In the garage
- Secured in your vehicle (Securing them is important to ensure these do not become a projectile in case of an accident.)

Most extinguishers come with a mounting bracket for ease of installation.

What type of extinguisher should I have?

Not all fires are the same so there are several types of fire extinguishers. The table below outlines our recommendation about which extinguishers are suitable for different fire types.

How to use an extinguisher?

Follow the 'PTASS' technique:

- Pull the safety pin or remove the clip.
- Test squirt the extinguisher to ensure it works.
- Aim the nozzle at the fire's base from a safe distance (usually 2-3 meters).
- Squeeze the handles.
- Sweep the extinguisher side to side while aiming at the fire's base.



Be familiar with the extinguisher and how to remove it from its location before you need to use it.

Fire extinguishers should only be used when it is safe to do so, e.g. the fire is no larger than a wastepaper basket or pot on a stove. Always have a safe path of escape if you are attempting to extinguish a fire and ensure Fire and Emergency has been called.



Property market report

July is the month of change for the property market. It is a change because many rules and restrictions change to remove red tape and restriction. Let's take a peek:

1/ The Labour Governments Capital Gains Tax (Alias the 10 year brightline test) is being thrown in the fire and replaced with a more modest and relaxed 2 year speculation tax, which makes sense for those wanting to buy and profit from



improvements or changes in a property on-sold under 24 months.

2/ The interest deductibility on rental property comes back into effect, allowing landlords to seek tax rebates on the interest paid on rental properties. Thus making it more affordable to own and operate in the rental space which may increase the number of rental properties available to the market. Based on demand and supply this may slow rent increases or at best give tenants more choice. It's fair to say that investors have been selling down portfolios rather than increasing them under the past government.

3/ The CCCFA is in for a shake down which covers a number of areas which make it easier for banks to comply with the "reasonable inquiries" section dealing with expenses and credit summery. Reform sees the act move from the Commerce Commission to the Financial Markets Authority indicating the willingness to make it simpler and easier to get money. In a statement from Chris Bishop, "Today's changes will still require lenders to act responsibly and ensure lending will not cause hardship, but lenders will not have to follow a prescriptive, one-size-fits-all process."

4/ New LVR rates for investors and home buyers comes into effect allowing home owners to borrow 6x annual income and investors 7x annual income. It may not be a game changer but at least property buyers understand the rules.

A look to the interest rates in play and you'll see ASB and Westpac have moved their 3 year mortgage rate to 6.39% and although the variable floating rate still sits at 8.64% it is a welcome sign that interest rates are coming down, albeit slower than most people wish.

So.............. What all this means is this, if you've been sitting on your hands and waiting for change, the tide may certainly be turning, property numbers on market are reducing and spring is literally months away. It makes it the best time to go shopping, negotiate well, and pick up a home that is a starter and affordable, as interest rates come down it will be easier to spend that extra money on renovations, debt consolidation or some treats.

Protect yourself from fraudulent rental listings

As the rental market becomes increasingly competitive, scammers have found new ways to exploit unsuspecting individuals. We want to ensure that you're fully aware of the potential risks and can identify and avoid rental scams.



Recently, there has been a surge in fraudulent activity on platforms such as Facebook Marketplace and group pages like "West Auckland Properties for Rent."

Scammers are replicating our genuine listings and advertising them on these sites, attempting to deceive potential renters. To safeguard yourself, it's crucial to know how to identify authentic Rent Shop listings. Genuine Rent Shop properties are only advertised on trusted platforms, specifically Trade Me and Realestate.co.nz. We do not use Facebook Marketplace or Facebook Messenger for communication regarding rental properties. If you see a listing on Facebook, it is likely a scam.

Always check the platform to ensure that the listing is on Trade Me or Realestate.co.nz. If it's on Facebook Marketplace or any Facebook group, it is not a genuine Rent Shop listing. The Rent Shop Hobsonville employees will never communicate with you via Facebook Messenger. Any such communication should be



considered suspicious. Use the 'Apply Now' button to apply for a property on Trade Me and is a secure way to submit your application.

Our application process is powered by a platform called "Renti." When you apply, you should see "renti.co" at the beginning of the web address. This ensures that you're on a secure and verified site. Be cautious of any other application processes or forms that do not follow this protocol. Before making any payments for bond or movein costs, it is essential to confirm the details to avoid falling victim to scams

Look up the property and the rental agency to ensure they are legitimate. Cross-reference the information on multiple trusted platforms. Whenever possible, view the property in person before making any payments. Scammers often use photos from real listings to deceive potential renters. Scammers will often create a sense of urgency to rush you into making a payment without proper verification. Take your time to confirm all details. If you encounter a suspected scam, report it to the platform where you found the listing and to local authorities. This helps protect others from falling victim.

Your safety and security is our top priority. We want to ensure that you have all the necessary information to protect yourself from rental scams. Always use trusted platforms, verify communication channels, and confirm payment details before proceeding with any transactions. By staying vigilant and following these guidelines, you can help prevent scams and secure a legitimate rental property.

A cautionary tale for property owners

Recently, I had a conversation with a property owner deeply concerned about the sale of a neighboring property for \$100,000 below market value. This sale has raised significant worries about how such a transaction could impact the sale of her own house. The situation sheds light on a crucial issue: the broader effects of selling properties below market value and the role of real estate agents in these outcomes. Another property owner I spoke with listed her property with the same real estate agent who had facilitated a low-price sale next door. This decision brought to the forefront a pressing question: do property owners realise that by choosing agents who habitually sell properties for less than their market value, they are encouraging a behaviour that can negatively impact their own investments?

The Ripple Effect of Below-Market Sales

When a property is sold for significantly less than its market value,



Titles and land covenants

Most land agents will tell you to get legal advice before you sign an agreement. It often cannot be known whether the developer ever approved these things or whether it can lead to expensive remedial work after you are committed to the purchase. Consequently, it is important for any purchaser to consider closely the nature of any covenants on a title.

July Kitchen Garden

With wetter weather around it is harder to get out in the garden, a good time to do some planning with a cup of tea in hand. Frosts and snow will be about in some areas, when in doubt cover and protect all your hard work.



Continue to plant garlic and shallots, it's not too late. July is the perfect time to plant new seasons deciduous fruit trees and citrus and don't forget - protect tender plants from frost. Strawberries can also be planted from now through to October.

Protect all seedlings from slugs and snails, they love tender seedlings and the wet weather also leave the soil alone when it is wet, working with wet soil will compact the structure making it clump.

Dig in any green crops that are ready, roughly turn in the soil and leave to rot into the soil before cultivation takes place.

Sow seeds of broccoli, cabbage, broad beans, cauliflower, peas, lettuce, onions, radish, spinach, silverbeet, swede and turnips. In warmer districts sow carrots, parsnips, and beetroot. Protect from the cold, transplant to the garden as the weather warms and when they are showing at least two sets of true leaves.

Broad beans can be planted directly into the soil, stagger sowing for a continuous harvest. If you have plants already underway pinch out the first flowers to improve cropping.

Plant seedlings: Cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower, lettuce, onions, silverbeet. Don't forget to keep them protected from the cold especially when they are young.

Sprouted potatoes can go in the ground in warm climates or prepare the ground for planting in the cooler regions.

Garlic and shallots can still be planted, give them plenty of that winter sun and plant strawberries in prepared beds. Feed with blood and bone as you plant.

Planting of new fruit trees can still be done - stake them well. All fruit tree pruning should be finished now.

Feed all vegetables with a liquid general fertiliser.

Power of birdsong to encourage native plantings

Think kowhai and tui.

They go together like gin and tonic or Barbie and Ken.

Native plants and birds are made for each other, which is why Auckland Council is using the power of native birdsong in a radio campaign that



launched this week to urge urban homeowners to plant natives in their gardens.

The goal of the campaign is to enlist Aucklanders' help to increase the region's canopy cover to 30 per cent - currently, the city only has 18 per cent urban canopy cover. Increasing canopy cover across the city brings with it cultural, social, economic, and environmental benefits, like improved water and air quality, greater biodiversity, shade and a reduction of carbon dioxide through carbon sequestration.

When it comes to attracting birds into backyards, Auckland Council's Head of Natural Environment Design Sam Hill says birdsong has a relaxing, calming effect on people.

"Birdsong is known to have a positive impact on health; it helps improve mental wellbeing, and when we plant natives in our gardens, we entice those native birds back.

"The bird-plant relationship is connected; you can attract specific birds to your yard by planting the right plants which in turn helps support the region's biodiversity."

A diverse range of native plants and shrubs in the back garden is the best way to attract native birds. The plants host seasonal fruit and nectar, and serve up insects that native birds have shaped their entire life cycles around. This creates a safe environment for them; a place to shelter, a place to nest.

"Any garden can be made more attractive to the human eye and a bird's eye, even if it is only small," says Sam.

"Select a range of native plants that provide food all-year-round, and that native backyard birds depend on. Make sure your backyard is a safe place for native birds to visit. If you don't have enough food sources in your garden, it may not be filled with birdsong," adds Sam.

Auckland Council can help recommend natives that thrive in specific areas of the region. To find out more visit ourauckland. aucklandcouncil.govt.nz

To help reach its urban canopy target, Auckland Council is implementing a winter planting programme, the Ngahere Street Tree Project, which will see the council plant 11,000 trees on street verges in Auckland over the next ten years. The 2024 planting season starts soon with the planting of 2,002 new trees on road corridors across 15 areas of the Auckland region.

The 2024 planting schedule is:

- May July: Papakura (141 trees); Manurewa (271 trees)
- June July: Ōtara-Papatoetoe (294 trees); Whau (72 trees); Henderson-Massey (100 trees); Rodney (19 trees); Kaipātiki (33 trees); Ōrākei (26 trees); Waitematā (42 trees); Albert-Eden (6 trees); Puketāpapa (30 trees); Howick (123 trees)
- July September: Franklin (55 trees); Māngere-Ōtāhuhu (554 trees); Maungakiekie-Tāmaki (236 trees).

Aucklanders can play their part in increasing Auckland's forest canopy by planting natives as they potter in the garden this autumn, and when listening to their favourite radio station throughout the day over the next month, they'll hear sounds of common native birds found in Auckland, and hopefully see them in backyards soon. Winter is upon us and you may not feel much like gardening at present, however now may be a good time to plan what you would like to grow next season. We have "spring" flowers out already and their fragrance is quite something, especially when the sun bothers to shine. Paperwhites are a close relative of daffodils and will bloom for a week or two before fading. Once the flowers appear, the blooms will last longer if you move the pot out of direct sunlight to a cool spot with indirect or diffused light. For continuous blooms,





plant pots every two weeks in the late autumn and early winter. If growing in the ground then you can bring cut flowers inside to enjoy their perfume. Or, if you prefer to leave them outside, once the blooms are spent, you can cut the stalks down at the base of the plant and leave the foliage. Maintain your paperwhite greens like you would a houseplant until the foliage dies back, usually around





Don't drag the chain with your dog registration

Are you a dog owner? Want to save money?

Then act now and register your dog before 1 August 2024. Auckland Council is reminding dog owners to show love for their dog by registering them early and taking advantage of the early-bird fee.



You can renew online using your dog reference number. You will receive a reminder email or text from us with your details around mid-June. New blue dog tags will be sent out by post within 10 working days of payment.

Use our online portal on myAUCKLAND to renew your registrations and update yours or your dog(s) information. With myAUCKLAND you can: update your personal details, update your dog's details, change your dog's ownership, view your dog's registration fees and status, renew your dog's registration.

For more information search "MyAUCKLAND" at aucklandcouncil.

Registering your dog is an important part of being a responsible dog owner. It provides safety for your dog and helps us reunite lost dogs with their owners should your dog stray or be lost.

With this year's dog registration, for every dog registered, \$1 will go towards a targeted de-sexing programme to reduce unwanted litters of puppies across Tāmaki Makaurau.

Dog owners must also microchip their dogs within two months of registration. Ultimately, all of Auckland's 130,000 dogs should be microchipped

Want to try honey in its natural form?

Ask Dr Heather

What is the best skincare regime? Anon, Whenuapai.

Skincare is complex. There is a lot of noise in the market with zero regulation. Most of us start (and often continue) a very basic regime inspired by supermarket shelves, television adverts and people we know. I myself have been victim of using all the no-no things including face cloths, soap and the dreaded St Ives Apricot Scrub.



A good regime consists of a few basics. Firstly, a pH balanced cleanser should be used to gently cleanse the skin without compromising the naturally acidic skin barrier. It doesn't really matter what product you use if the pH is balanced, however be weary of marketing ploys such as foam (foam does not equal better cleaning) and addition of ingredients such a hyaluronic acid as they are washed away during the cleansing process.

After cleansing, application of an antioxidant serum is a great idea. Vitamin C is a fantastic option for daytime as it is great for environmental protection, minimising pigmentation and encouraging collagen production. A good alternative for day (or nighttime) is Vitamin B, which helps minimise wrinkles, improve skin tone and also acts to enhance collagen production.

Another great serum for nighttime is the famous Vitamin A, AKA, retinol. The hero ingredient to any skincare regime, this powerful micro-nutrient speeds up skin cell turnover, minimises pigmentation, reduces acne, stimulates collagen production and diminishes wrinkles. Care must be taken when starting retinol however as it can cause skin irritation, so staggering its use initially and slowly building to nightly application is recommended. Many products on

the market claim to contain retinol, however shop around as some instead contain very weak retinoid esters (retinyl palmitate, retinyl acetate and retinyl linoleate), that take many years of consistent use to have effect.

On top of serums, one should then apply a quality moisturiser that suits your skin type. Dry skin needs thicker moisturisers, whereas oily skin prefers oil-free concoctions. Choose something that smells and feels good and be sure to also apply it on the neck and backs of the hands as these areas are often neglected and eventually become telltale signs of a person's true age (you'll start noticing those celebrity close-ups now).

Finally, during the day don't forget SPF! Super important to minimise ageing as the harsh ultraviolet rays from the sun (on cloudy and clear days) will undo all the good work you do with your skincare regime. Just be sure to pick a product that you like that doesn't make you look and feel like a greaseball.

Everyone can benefit from a good skincare regime; the key is to understand the basics and resist marketing tactics by big brands. A good rule of thumb is if it's advertised in mainstream media, it probably isn't worth your time (and money) as quality products don't need big advertisements to demonstrate their worth.

Menopause

NZ has a shortage of oestrogen patches. You may have seen this headline and the conversations that have gone on...you may be one of the women affected or you may have wondered what all the fuss is about.

Whilst for some menopause is a natural transition with few symptoms this is not the case for all. For some menopause comes early (sometimes in the thirties) as a result of medical



or even surgical reasons. For some menopause brings symptoms so severe it impacts not just health but relationships and work and can ruin lives.

Menopause Hormone Therapy is a highly effective treatment for a lot of women. The form that has the best safety record is through patches and gels (known as transdermal) unlike the tablet form.



Some research has also shown that transdermal oestrogen may reduce the risk of several chronic diseases known to affect postmenopausal women.

In NZ, only one brand of patches is fully funded. Many other countries have other forms of oestrogen in gels and creams. For some reason, they are not funded in NZ. Having these gels funded would mean women who NEED oestrogen have another option during the patch shortage. It also offers an alternative for some women who cannot absorb oestrogen from the patches and who have an allergy to the patches.

This shortage is cruel and creates a huge amount of anxiety in women who are already vulnerable. Last year Pharmac agreed to start the process of funding however the last time Pharmac started the process of funding progesterone - it took 10 years. A petition urging Pharmac to expedite the funding process has been created with currently over 13, 000 signatures. The goal is 15,000.



Calming the farm

A calm mind can be a very productive and creative mind.

On the flip side, times of high stress can lead to bad decisions, or even the inability to make any decisions like a possum in the headlights.





can stand us in good stead for when we encounter high levels of stress. Consider a daily practice as training the mind. Most of us understand the concept of training the body. If you want to be a marathon runner, you start off running short distances and gradually increase your stamina and ability to run over longer distances. Eventually you will likely be able to run 42km. While being able to run a marathon may amaze people, it won't come as any surprise to those that know how much training you've done. Training the mind should be similar and involve daily practices that gradually help you to build up resilience to life's challenges.

A Helping Hand

Sometimes life throws stressful events at you before you have had time to train for them. There are a couple of great supplements that I wanted to highlight that can help support you to a calm and effective mind during such times.

L-Theanine

Theanine is a relatively uncommon amino acid that blocks excitatory nervous system receptors such as AMPA, Kainate and NMDA receptors, while boosting the calming GABA receptors. The result is reduced anxiety, depression and stress, yet increased attention, alertness and ability to learn. Studies have also shown an ability to alleviate premenstrual syndrome (PMS) symptoms.

Theanine does not cause drowsiness (but by reducing stress can improve your ability to sleep) or addiction (has been shown to



reduce withdrawal effects from morphine).

Theanine works quite quickly with peak plasma levels occurring about 30 minutes after taking an oral dose. However, the effects do wear off within a few hours. For this reason, I like to recommend lower doses (about 50 to 150mg) which can be repeated regularly as needed. Some supplements are packed with high doses (400mg) which seems unnecessary as it is no more effective and will also wear off in a few hours.

Chamomile for Kids

One very much overlooked supplement is chamomile for overactive kids or kids who struggle to get to sleep. The reason it is overlooked may be that unlike theanine, chamomile doesn't work instantly but needs to build up before it works. With Chamomile, you need to take it four times a day for a few days before you see some improvement in sleep. If you have kids that have difficulty sleeping, I recommend using chamomile four times a day for a few days and watching the results. It's life-changing when you get your young ones to sleep.

Where is your pain actually coming from?

Have you ever visited a physiotherapist for pain in one area, only to have them focus on a completely different spot? It can be a puzzling experience, made even more bewildering when the treatment works. But why does this happen? Shouldn't pain be addressed where it's felt?

source, it's termed "referred pain" and it's more common than you might think. The exact mechanisms behind referred pain are



complex, and there's still much we don't understand about how pain is processed.

Typically, pain arises when damage occurs, sending electrical signals to the brain. The brain interprets these signals, associating them with specific body parts and types of pain. However, when the brain perceives pain in a different area than the actual source, referred pain occurs.

Some instances of referred pain are straightforward, such as when nerve damage causes pain to radiate along its path. However, there are more mysterious cases, like phantom limb pain experienced by amputees.

Muscular trigger points are another cause of referred pain, where tight muscle bands lead to pain patterns throughout the body. Additionally, various tissues, including spinal discs and internal organs, can generate pain felt in unexpected places, sometimes mimicking unrelated conditions.

Dry eye July

A report by Molly Whittington from For Eyes Optometrists in the Kumeu Shopping Village.

Do you have dry eyes? Winter's indoor heating and outdoor wind can wreak havoc and many people with dry eyes find discomfort worsens over the winter months. Sometimes their eyes get so dry it triggers



watering, causing the eyes to stream outdoors.

Dry eyes are caused by a tear-film imbalance. The tear film has a base mucous layer, a middle liquid layer, and a surface oil layer to prevent evaporation.

One of the most common causes of dry eye syndrome is a poorquality oil layer. The Meibomian glands, which are located along the eyelid margins, produce this oil. You can improve the oil production by applying heat to the eyelids, followed by a gentle massage of the closed eyelids, especially along the lash-line. A microwaveable heat mask is available from For Eyes, or you can use hot water and a face cloth. Apply the heat for at least 5 minutes, to really soften the oil in the glands, prior to massaging. Another trick: blinking more often (and more firmly) helps express more oil onto the tear film surface.

Artificial tears do not cure the condition but can provide immediate relief and are available without a prescription. If you need to use eye drops more than three times a day, you should use preservative-free drops. I recommend NovaTears Plus or Hyloforte 2%.

Grief- you can work through it

Some people in our lives touch our hearts from the moment we first met them. Other times, it could be someone who has been in our lives from the day we were born or they may be a well-known person such as a member of the Royal Family, a celebrity, or another famous person

Workplace personal phone use policy

Most of us have a personal mobile phone and keep it with us all the time. Some surveys suggest that we reach for our mobile phone up to 58 times a day, spending on average at least 3 hours a day on our phones.

So what amount of use is acceptable in the workplace?

This does vary depending on the industry and type of job, so how do you make it clear to your employees and contractors what is acceptable?

Personal phone use policies that are read and agreed to by all staff ensure consistency and fairness, and gives a basis for enforcement when company policies are referenced in employment or contractor agreements.

Here are some tips on what to include:

- The scope of the policy, eg employees, contractors and temporary staff while performing work related duties
- What are the restrictions, eg personal use only during designated breaks, or no personal use when customer facing, in a production environment, or around heavy machinery?
- Safety considerations, eg must be hands free while driving
- Phone call etiquette. Eg keeping your phone on silent/vibrate, stepping out to take your call so not to interrupt others
- Security considerations, eg making sure phones are regularly updated and have password protection if also used for work purposes
- Exceptions to the policy, eg on call, family emergencies
- What actions will be taken if there is a breach of the policy, eg disciplinary action

Once you have documented your policy, it is important to get all staff affected to agree to the policy and to acknowledge their understanding. Get the team involved with writing the policy if you think you will get some resistance. Ask them to suggest what a fair policy looks like.

This policy then forms part of your company policy and procedures manual that should be reviewed at least annually and discussed with your staff as a gentle reminder of what they agreed to.

Having a fair policy in place can eliminate complaints on how much

Dr Hannah Ritchie, a data scientist with the University of Oxford, crunched the numbers to find that out. She's also studied the data in thousands of research papers from around the world and found that, generally, things are getting better, not worse. It's not fashionable to be an optimist in a world full of bad news, she says, but the numbers prove that we can be.

According to the data, we are healthier, richer, and living longer than ever before, although this has come at the expense of the planet. Ritchie explores seven huge problems facing humanity today: the climate crisis, plastic pollution, air pollution, over-fishing, broken food systems, biodiversity loss, and deforestation.

Using data, she traces the evolution of each problem, then explores the solutions we already have that, if scaled up, would give us the opportunity to solve them. At the end of each chapter, she suggests things we can all do (e.g. eating less meat and dairy), and "things to stress less about" (things that her data shows don't really make a difference, like eating locally grown, organic food).

While full of data, graphs and charts (with a website if you want more https://www.nottheendoftheworld.co.uk/explore-data), the book is easy and fun to read, and peppered with anecdotes, funny stories from her own life about how understanding the big picture has changed her beliefs. It may change yours.

I loved this 'shot in the arm' of positivity, but I couldn't help feeling she avoids discussing the biggest roadblock in the way of these solutions – governments around the world that aren't taking the action needed, and in some cases are taking us backwards. The average citizen isn't able to build solar farms or change world food systems. We can vote, write letters, sign petitions and protest, and it seems Ritchie misses a real opportunity to motivate readers to do the things that may really give us a chance to avoid the end of the world.

Thank you to everyone who submitted on the Auckland Council Long Term Plan (LTP), we are currently analysing the data. In May the Local Board will give feedback to the Governing Body who will debate and discuss the LTP. They will make changes and adopt a final version in June. This LTP sets out the



budget and direction for the next 10 years. Meanwhile, the Upper Harbour Local Board members are busy working out next years' work programmes (which involves balancing tight budgets while also achieving the objectives we have in our Local Board Plan) and reviewing projects underway already.

By the time this goes to print the refreshed playground at Starlight

Park in Hobsonville will be open, hopefully everyone who goes there is enjoying it. We are planning on other projects in the West Harbour and Hobsonville Communities, I'll share more details in a future update.



Conservation secures future for New Zealand's rarest whitebait

A conservation project to create a secure future for New Zealand's rarest whitebait species, the shortjaw kōkopu, is getting a helping hand to increase the fish presence in the wild.





The Huia catchment is about to become home to up to 800 fingerlings (baby kōkopu). Bred in captivity, the fish will be released into streams feeding the Upper Huia Reservoir. Developmental impacts have degraded kōkopu habitat. Establishing more wild populations is an important step in the conservation of this species, and acts as an insurance policy for their ongoing survival.

In preparation for the species' return to the wild, the fingerlings have - in a world first - been bred from scratch by Manāki Whitebait, using parent stock from the Waitākere Ranges. They were transported to the dam site in a fish tanker before being transferred by boat, then

carried upstream to the release sites by staff.

The project will be monitored for several years to assess how well the species take to their new home and whether the fish are reproducing above the reservoir.

Health and Safety at Work (Adventure Activities)

Earlier last year the previous Labour government quietly passed into law significant changes to the Health and Safety at Work Act - 2015 and associated regulations. In this second part of changes, we examine the recently introduced Health and Safety at Work (Adventure Activities) Amendment Regulations - 2023.

Following the Whakaari/White Island eruption on 9 December 2019, the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety directed the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MBIE) to undertake a targeted review of the adventure activities regulatory regime.

The work considered whether weaknesses exist in the adventure activities regime when adventure activities take place in "naturally hazardous" environments.

Adventure activities are activities which are paid for and involve the participant being guided or taught; They are designed to deliberately expose the participant to serious risk, and in which failure of the provider's management systems is likely to result in serious risk to the participant's health and safety, and the participant is deliberately exposed to dangerous terrain or waters.

The changes focus on 4 areas:

- 1. Introducing specific requirements for how adventure activity operators must assess and manage natural hazard risks
- 2. Strengthening requirements for operators to communicate risks to activity participants
- 3. Stronger operator registration and notification requirements
- 4. Reviewing and updating adventure activity safety guidance.

The Regulation now requires stronger operator registration and notification requirements, and the changes are:

• A duty under the Regulations for adventure activity operators to take all reasonable steps to inform persons seeking to participate in adventure activities of any serious risks they may be exposed to by participating in the activity.

- Adventure activity operators must obtain a safety audit by an accredited safety auditor and be registered by WorkSafe as an adventure activities operator in order to offer their activities.
- The Regulations make it an offence for operators to provide or offer to provide an adventure activity unless registered.
- Expanding the circumstances under which WorkSafe can refuse, suspend, cancel or add conditions to operator registrations, where serious safety concerns arise.
- Providing WorkSafe the power to temporarily suspend an operator's registration while the operator is under investigation.
- Reviewing and updating adventure activity safety guidance
- Introducing sector specific notifiable incidents, requiring operators to report incidents associated with hazards in the sector to WorkSafe.

JAS-ANZ - The Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand - has developed a specific certification scheme in association with WorkSafe NZ and the adventure activities industry. WorkSafe NZ is the scheme owner.

The New Zealand Adventure Activities Certification Scheme has its own Safety Audit Standard that is accepted by the Regulator/Registrar - WorkSafe NZ.

Two Certification Bodies in New Zealand have been accredited by JAS-ANZ to provide these certified audits to date.

The new Coalition Government has indicated that it will review the Health and Safety At Work Act – 2015 to make employees as well as employers (PCBU'S) accountable and fairer for everyone. Given the tragic events that occurred on Whakaari/White Island, this is one part of the legislation that probably won't be changed.
